

ESAA – WARWICKSHIRE ROLL OF HONOUR

The *Warwickshire Schools Athletic Association* was formed in 1947.

Its first County Championship was held on 26th June, 1948 on the Technical College Ground at Rugby. It was a 49-event meeting for 3 district Associations : Rugby, Solihull and Stratford-on-Avon together with a few competitors from Kenilworth. Rugby was the most successful Association winning the most points in the Boys and Girls Intermediate and Senior age groups.

Anne Edgington was Warwickshire's first ESAA Champion in 1953 when she won the Junior long jump title.

The implementation of the 1972 Local Government Act on April 1st, 1974 resulted in the creation of the metropolitan county of West Midlands. It was a significant change for Warwickshire with the boroughs of Birmingham, Coventry and Solihull now becoming part of West Midlands. This meant that Warwickshire went from being a Group A county to a Group C county with a considerable reduction in the number of permitted participants at the Track and Field Championships.

MULTI-SPORT ATHLETES

Many gifted young athletes who competed in the English Schools' Athletic Association (ESAA) Championships have become very successful in a wide variety of sports including Bobsleigh, Boxing, Cricket, Cycling, Darts, Football, Hockey, Modern Pentathlon, Netball, Powerlifting, Rowing, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Skeleton, Triathlon and Weightlifting.

Details follow of four Warwickshire ESAA competitors who went on to have a successful career in other sports :

BOBSLEIGH – JOEL FEARON

Joel represented Warwickshire when finishing 6th in the 2007 ESAA Senior 100 metres. He took up bobsleigh in 2011 and combined it with a successful athletics career. In 2016 he became only the 7th British athlete to run the 100 metres in under 10 seconds and ran in several Diamond League meetings.

Joel won an Olympic bronze in the 4-man bob at the Sochi 2014 games. The team had originally placed 5th but the disqualification (6 years later !) of 2 Russian sleds led to their rightful promotion to the bronze medal position.

FOOTBALL – MARGARET MIKS

Margaret represented Warwickshire in the Javelin Throw at several ESAA Championships in the early 1970s with her best finish being 5th in the 1972 Intermediate event. She was already playing football for Coventry Bantams at this time.

In June 1973, just before appearing in the 1973 ESAA Championship, Margaret won her first cap for the England football team in a match against Scotland at Nuneaton. Ladies international football was in its infancy with this match being only the third official England Ladies football international.

She went on to gain 7 caps for England between 1973 and 1975.

RUGBY UNION – DAVID DUCKHAM MBE

David represented Warwickshire and reached the semi-finals of the 1964 ESAA Senior 200 yards Hurdles. He was already playing rugby union for the Warwickshire Under-19s at this time.

He made his Coventry rugby union debut in 1967, the first of 188 appearances for the club in a 12-year career. He made his full England Rugby Union debut in 1969 and amassed 36 caps before his England career ended in 1978.

David also played 3 times for the British and Irish Lions in the successful tour to New Zealand in 1971.

RUGBY UNION – GEOFF EVANS

ESAA – WARWICKSHIRE ROLL OF HONOUR

Geoff represented Warwickshire when winning the 1967 ESAA Intermediate Long Jump.

He made his Coventry RFC debut in February 1971 as a team mate of David Duckham. Just over a year later, after playing only 38 first-class matches for Coventry, he made his debut for England against Scotland in March 1972. At 21 years and 3 months he was England's youngest centre for over 30 years.

Geoff played 9 times for England from March 1972 to March 1974 and also toured South Africa in 1974 with the British and Irish Lions.

RUGBY UNION – JOHN YOUNG

John represented Warwickshire when winning the 1954 ESAA Inter 100 yards title and the 1955 and 1956 ESAA Senior 220 yards titles. He was still a pupil at Bishop Vesey's Grammar School in Sutton Coldfield when he won the 1956 AAA 100 yards title. He then went to Oxford University to study law and gained athletics and rugby blues.

The first of his 9 caps for England came while he was at Oxford University. In 1959 John started a 7-season career for Harlequins making 102 appearances. His England career lasted from 1958 to 1961 and he also played 1 test for the British Lions against New Zealand in 1959.

After his rugby career was over he became a selector for the England RFU.
